A LONGTIME QUILTER, JUDY WAS DIAGNOSED WITH BREAST CANCER IN JANUARY OF 2012.

She had a mastectomy in February and started aggressive chemo in March, finishing at the end of June. One of the things that sustained her through the year was making quilts about the breast cancer experience. Judy dyes and prints all the fabrics she uses in her quilt tops, pieces

the tops, and then takes them to Sue McCarty who machine quilts them for her.

The more than 20 amazing quilts featured in this trunk show fall into 3 categories:

1. What the Body Knew

In late 2011, Judy made a number of quilts that, at the time, seemed unrelated. She didn't know what they were about until after my diagnosis. But, her body knew what



was going on and tried to communicate that to her through her quilt making.

2. Journal Quilts

In November 2011, Judy started making one 8" by 8" square each day and then writing what had happened that day, or what she was thinking about.

3. The Breast Cancer Experience

Judy has made a series of quilts focusing on a particular idea related to her breast cancer experience. Showcasing these quilts at HMQS is part of Judy's plan to share these quilts through exhibits. In the longer term, she plans to write a book about coping with breast cancer through quilt making.



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

Online Quilt Entry Instructions & HMQS Conditions

- HMQS Quilt Competition is <u>not</u> a juried competition.
- For questions, contact Polly Holyoak, 801-262-7706, polly@hmqs.org or Patsy Shelton,801-782-4673, patsy@hmqs.org

Online Entries: Entrants in the Quilt Exhibit may enter 3 quilts into the Judged exhibit and 3 quilts into the Exhibit Only area (display conditional upon space availability). Each entry must fall under the definition of a quilt that consists of 3 layers, i.e., quilt top, batting, and backing. <u>Entries</u> <u>must be machine quilted. No handquilted entries. Quilts completed before the end of April 2010 may not be entered.</u> <u>Previous entries to the HMQS quilt competition will be disqualified. Entries that are larger than 480" will not be accepted.</u>



HMQA reserves the right to place entrants' quilts in a more appropriate category if deemed necessary.

If you have problems with the online quilt entry, please contact by phone, Patsy Shelton, (801) 782-4673.

Deadlines: Quilt entry must be submitted no later than April 12, 2013. Quilts must be received between April 12-26, 2013.

Photographs: Two photos MUST accompany each quilt entry for identification purposes, one picture of the entire quilt and one close-up. <u>These photos should be</u> uploaded during the online entry process.

Label: Each quilt must have a quilt label (sewn on by hand or machine) to a lower corner of the back of the quilt. Each label needs to include: Name of Quilt, Quilt Owner's Name and Address.

Sleeve: Each quilt must have attached to the back a 4-inch sleeve at the top of the quilt enabling the HMQA volunteers to properly hang each quilt. Art quilts must be able to be hung with minimal attention. Quilts delivered without the required 4" sleeves will be judged but not photographed or hung in the quilt exhibit.

Show Insurance: HMQA will insure quilts up to \$500 for a mandatory cost of \$5. It is highly recommended that quilts over \$500 in value be appraised and the owner has appropriate insurance to insure the quilt while in transit and at HMQS 2013. Quilts appraised value over \$500 are the owner's responsibility to insure.

Shipping/Drop Off: Ship or drop off quilts in clear or any transparent color plastic bags only. The number must be seen through the bag. No black bags, pillowcases or other cloth bags. Bags will not be returned. <u>Please include the quilt entry # on</u> the front of the shipping box.

Return Shipping and Insurance: The return shipping cost is \$25, and additional quilts will cost \$15 each. Insurance for quilt shipping is \$1 for every \$100 of the quilt value. All return shipping and insurance fees must be paid with the quilt entry form.



International entries or Odd shaped/ sized or tube packaging MUST enclose a PRE-PAID RETURN SHIPPING LABEL with the shipped quilt. Shipping fees are non-refundable.

Quilt Return: Quilts may be picked up at the designated secure location on Saturday, May 11, 2013, 6:00-7:00 p.m. No quilts will be released from the exhibit floor. The quilts will be returned to owner upon proof of ownership. Picture ID will be required. All quilts shipped will be sent no later than 7 days after the show closes, unless other arrangements are made. Quilt shipments will be made by UPS or FedEx. P.O. Box addresses will be sent by USPS.

Awards: Cash prizes and awards will be given to the person submitting the Online Quilt Entry Form. It is the intention of HMQS to award ribbons only during HMQS Awards Ceremony. Otherwise, all cash prizes and awards will be sent to winners within 14 days of the show closing.

Conditions: Entrants agree that they will abide by the HMQA judges' decisions.

By checking the box indicated on the Online Entry Form, entrants agree to the following conditions:

- HMQA reserves the right to refuse to hang any quilts that are received in poor condition, including, but not limited to: No binding, fabric is torn or stained, quilt is poorly constructed or was misrepresented in the photos, exceeds the size limitations, etc.
- HMQA reserves the right to place entrant's quilt in a more appropriate category if deemed necessary.
- HMQA reserves the right to accept or refuse any quilt for entrance into HMQS 2013 quilt exhibit. Entrant will not hold HMQA, HMQS 2013, South Towne Expo Center, event management or any of the above-mentioned employees or volunteers liable for damages or loss of quilt beyond the insurance limitations specified in this form.

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HMQS Competition Categories

Best of Show: This quilt is deemed by the judges as the best quilt in all categories.

Best Combination: Quilt made by a combination of piecers, appliquérs and/or machine quilters. A group effort, more than one person worked on the quilt.

Best Novice: This quilt was quilted by someone who has been machine quilting for one year or less.

Best Solitaire: One person pieced or appliquéd and machine quilted the quilt.

Viewers' Choice: Ballots cast by attendees will decide this award.

Youth 14 & Younger: This award is given to an outstanding quilt made by a youth quilter 14 years old or younger. This award is sponsored to recognize youthful quilters and encourage the next generation of quilters.

Judge's Choice: These awards will be given by the quilt judges to two quilts in the competition.

Theme "That's Amore!": Must be easily identifiable as representing the theme. Must have 3 layers: Quilt top, batting, and backing. Perimeter 220" to 480".

Appliqué: Quilts in this category should be predominantly appliquéd. Appliqué may be applied by hand or machine. Perimeter 220" to 480".

Art/Innovative: Quilts in this category will be judged for their artistic merit, design and detailed quilting. Addition of beads, buttons or other objects will be acceptable providing that they are securely attached and the quilt can be hung with minimal care. Perimeter 80" to 480".

Computerized Quilting: Quilts machine quilted using a computerized quilting system. All types of quilts are permitted in this category. Perimeter 80"to 480".

Conventional Machine: This category is for quilts quilted on a machine by the "push-through" method of quilting. All types of quilts are permitted in this category. Perimeter 80" to 480".

Edge to Edge: This category is for entry by a novice, less experienced or reticent quilter. The quilting on this entry must be an overall design that covers the entire quilt without any regard to the blocks or borders of the quilt. No "stitch in the ditch" quilting. No computerized quilting. Perimeter 220" to 480".

Embroidery: This is the perfect category to showcase your embroidery quilts! The predominant embroidery on these quilts may be done either by hand or machine. Perimeter 220" to 480".

Mixed Technique: Any two or more techniques in combination which can include piecing, appliqué, embroidery, photos or painting. Perimeter 80" to 480".

Modern: Quilts that are functional, include bold colors, and are inspired by modern design. Minimalism, asymmetry, expansive negative space, and alternate grid work are often a part of modern quilt compositions, as are improvisational piecing and solid fabrics. Perimeter 220"- 480" Must be three layers; backing, batting and quilt top.

Novelty Custom: Unusual and creative stitching designs, inventive, non-traditional block motifs and background fillers. Unique and non-matching thread choices are allowed. This category is the opposite of Traditional. Perimeter 220" to 480".

Off The Bed: This category is for entry by a novice, less experienced or reticent quilter. This category is for quilts that are practical, utilitarian, everyday useful quilts, consisting of three layers. No embellishments. Perimeter 270" to 480". **Traditional Custom:** Traditional patterns for blocks & construction. Quilting such as stitch-in-the-ditch, feathers, crosshatching, & echo quilting. Threads should match the fabric of the quilt as much as possible. Perimeter 220" to 480".

Utah's Own: This category is sponsored to recognize three outstanding quilts by Utah quilt makers. All types of quilts are permitted in this category. Perimeter 80" to 480".

Wall Hanging: Not less than 80" or more than 240". May be pieced or appliquéd, traditional or novelty in design.

Whole Cloth: One piece of fabric, quilted to create a design. Quilt may be seamed only to join pieces of the same fabric to acquire the desired size. Perimeter 168" to 480".

Youth 18 & Younger: Quilts in this area MUST be entirely pieced and machine quilted by the Youth 18 & under, either by long/short arm method or conventional push-through method. Perimeter not to exceed 480". No computerized quilting.

Quilted Garment Categories: A limit of 3 garment entries in the categories listed below.

Quilted Garment/Wearables: Garment must have three layers, be machine quilted and can have embellishments.

Quilted Garment/Ensemble: Garment with multiple pieces, consisting of but not limited to jacket, vest, dress, shirt, skirt or pants.

Exhibit Only: A quilter may submit up to three (3) quilts for non-judged Exhibit Only. All Exhibit Only quilts must fit the definitions of a quilt described above, and may be in any of the above categories. Display conditional on space availability. All exhibit only quilts must be machine quilted.





Judy Elsley HMQS Featured Artist & Special Quilt Display

THIS IS JUDY'S STORY IN HER OWN WORDS. A little about me: I've worked at Weber State University for 22 years, teaching in the English Department. I also run the university's Honors Program. I was born and raised in England, and came to this country in 1979. I'm a long-time quilter who learned to dye fabrics 9 years ago.

In the first week of January, I was diagnosed with breast cancer. I had a mastectomy in February and started aggressive chemo in March, finishing at the end of June. 2012 has been an intense year for me.

One of the things that sustained me through the year was making quilts about the breast cancer experience. I dye and print all the fabrics I use in my quilt tops, starting with white PFD cotton. I piece the tops, and then take them to Sue McCarty who machine quilts them for me.

This body of work consists of over 20 quilts which fall into three categories:

1. What the Body Knew

In late 2011, I made a number of quilts that, at the time, seemed unrelated. I didn't know what they were about until after my diagnosis. My body knew what was going on and tried to communicate that to me through my quilt making.

2. Journal Quilts

In November 2011, I started making one 8" by 8" square each day and then writing what had happened that day, or what I was thinking about. I had two goals in doing this. First, I wanted to prepare for my up-



coming sabbatical by getting into the habit of working with fabric every day, and second, I'm interested in integrating my two passions: writing and fabric work. In other words, text and textile.

3. The Breast Cancer Experience

I've made a series of quilts focusing on a particular idea related to my breast cancer experience. Again, all the tops are made from my hand-dyed and printed fabrics, and I write on each of them, "What will I do with these quilts?" In the short term, I want to exhibit them as a body of work. In the longer term, I will write a book about coping with breast cancer through quilt making.

"The Farmer's Wife" Special Quilt Exhibit

FOR THE LAST TWO YEARS, 16 WOMEN have met in Layton, UT once a month for lunch to exchange "Farmer's Wife Quilt" blocks. The "Farmer's Wife Quilt" book was written by Laurie Hird. There are 111 blocks in the quilt. The Farmer's Wife sampler quilt was inspired from letters written in 1920's by farmer's wives. The Pittsburgh Observer newspaper had a contest for their readers. The paper had noticed a change for the worse during the past year in feminine dress, manners and general moral standards of women. With the end of World War I, the stock market crash, jazz music, and talking movies came into existence. Times were changing and women were coming into the forefront. With all these changes in our culture the paper ran a contest. The paper asked their readers to answer a simple question. "If you had a daughter of marriageable age, would you, in light of your own experience, want her to marry a farmer?" The end result was an overwhelming 7,000 letters from the readers. When the opinions were tallied, it was found that the editors were correct, 94% of the readers indeed, wanted their daughter to marry a farmer. Each of the 111 quilt blocks in the book is accompanied with a letter from the contest.

by AQS Certified Quilt Appraiser, Sandra Starley of Textile Time Travels

SANDRA STARLEY IS A NATIONALLY CERTIFIED

quilt appraiser, historian, researcher, quilt collector, lecturer and quilt show judge. She is one of the two certified appraisers in Utah (there are about 90 in the entire United States) and is certified in the appraisal of antique, vintage and newly made quilts including art quilts. She offers written appraisals for insurance, fair market, and donation/estate values and will have a booth at HMQS 2013! Look for the booth with antique quilts and a smiling face!

Sandra travels throughout the country to do appraisals, present trunk shows on quilt history and fabric dating, and workshops on traditional and art quilt techniques (especially hand appliqué). She has an extensive collection of antique, vintage and newly made quilts (covering 200 years of American quilts) which she uses to teach quilt history and fabric study.

A written appraisal describes your quilt: its age, fabrics, colors, pattern,

quilting design, condition, notable points, workmanship and value. This information allows you to properly insure your quilt so you can replace it with a comparable quilt if it is lost, stolen, or damaged. A fair market appraisal can help guide you in valuing your quilts if you are interested in selling them. Note that appraisals aren't just for old quilts—with the increasing costs of materials and labor, new quilts often are valued higher than antique quilts.

The fee for a written appraisal at the show is just \$40. While walk-ins are welcome, appointments are recommended and appreciated. To schedule an appointment, please call (435) 253-1115 or email gingham@frontiernet.net. Quilts that are hanging in the show can also be easily appraised. The completed appraisal along with photos of your quilt will be mailed to you after the show.




